_____ Survivors of Homicide Victims
The children, spouse, parent, or other live-in relative of an individual that has been recklessly, maliciously, or negligently killed by another.

_____ Adult Sexual Assault *
Any physical contact of a sexual nature without voluntary consent.

_____ Child Sexual Assault – Family *
Any physical contact of a child by a family member or someone significantly older and in a position of power or control over the child.

_____ Robbery
Act of seizing property through violence or intimidation.

_____ Theft/Larceny
Unauthorized entering of another's property and taking, keeping, or using of their tangible property with intent to permanently deprive the owner of it.

_____ Motor Vehicle Theft
Criminal act of stealing or attempting to steal any motorized vehicle.

_____ Arson
Willfully setting fire to a building, dwelling, or property.

_____ Child Sexual Assault – Other
Any physical contact of a child by an adult or someone significantly older than the child and/or in a position of power or control over the child.

Aggravated Assault

Violent crime against another person where serious bodily injuries occurred and/or a dangerous weapon was used.

Burglary

Unauthorized entry into a building, dwelling, or property for purposes of committing an offense.

DUI/DWI Crashes

Victim(s) of a motor vehicle accident when operator was driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs.

Sexual Exploitation *

Any sexual activity not included in sexual assault or sexual harassment. May include: forced prostitution, pornography, online enticement, or obscene materials.

Sexual Harassment *

Unwelcome verbal or physical sexual advances.

Stalking *

A pattern of offensive behavior involving repeated harassment or other forms of invasion of a person's privacy that may cause fear.

Exposing *

Act of unlawfully exposing one's genitalia to another without voluntary consent.

Obscene Phone Calls *

Unsolicited telephone call where the caller attempts to annoy or frighten the called party.

Embezzlement

Dishonestly and unlawfully appropriating goods.

Stolen Property

Criminal act of unlawfully taking property of another.

Vandalism/Criminal to Property

To willfully damage or deface property without the owner's permission.

Disorderly Conduct

Reckless and/or intentional engagement in fighting or tumultuous conduct, unreasonable noise, or disrupting a lawful assembly of persons.

Adult Sexually Abused as Child-- Family *

Any physical sexual contact that an adult experienced as a child by a family member or someone who was significantly older and in a position of power or control over them

Adult sexually abused as Child - Other *

Any physical contact that an adult experienced as a child by an adult or someone that was significantly older than the child and in a position of power or control over the child.

Domestic Abuse *

A family member, partner, or ex-partner attempts to physically or psychologically dominate another

Other Assault (not agg., sexual, or domestic)

An act of violence by one person against another.

Terroristic Threats/Harassment

Intentional behaviors directed at another person that are threatening or disturbing and/or behaviors that cause another fear of injury or harm.

Other Felony Level

Other felony crime not previously listed.

OFP/HRO Violation *

Offender has violated terms and conditions in the OFP or HRO against them.

Forgery/Counterfeiting

The process of making or adapting objects with the intent to deceive. Including but not limited to documents or currency.

Fraud

Deliberately deceiving another with the intent to damage them; usually to obtain services or property unjustly.

Other Gross Misdemeanor and/or Misdemeanor Level

Other Gross Misdemeanor crimes not previously listed.
